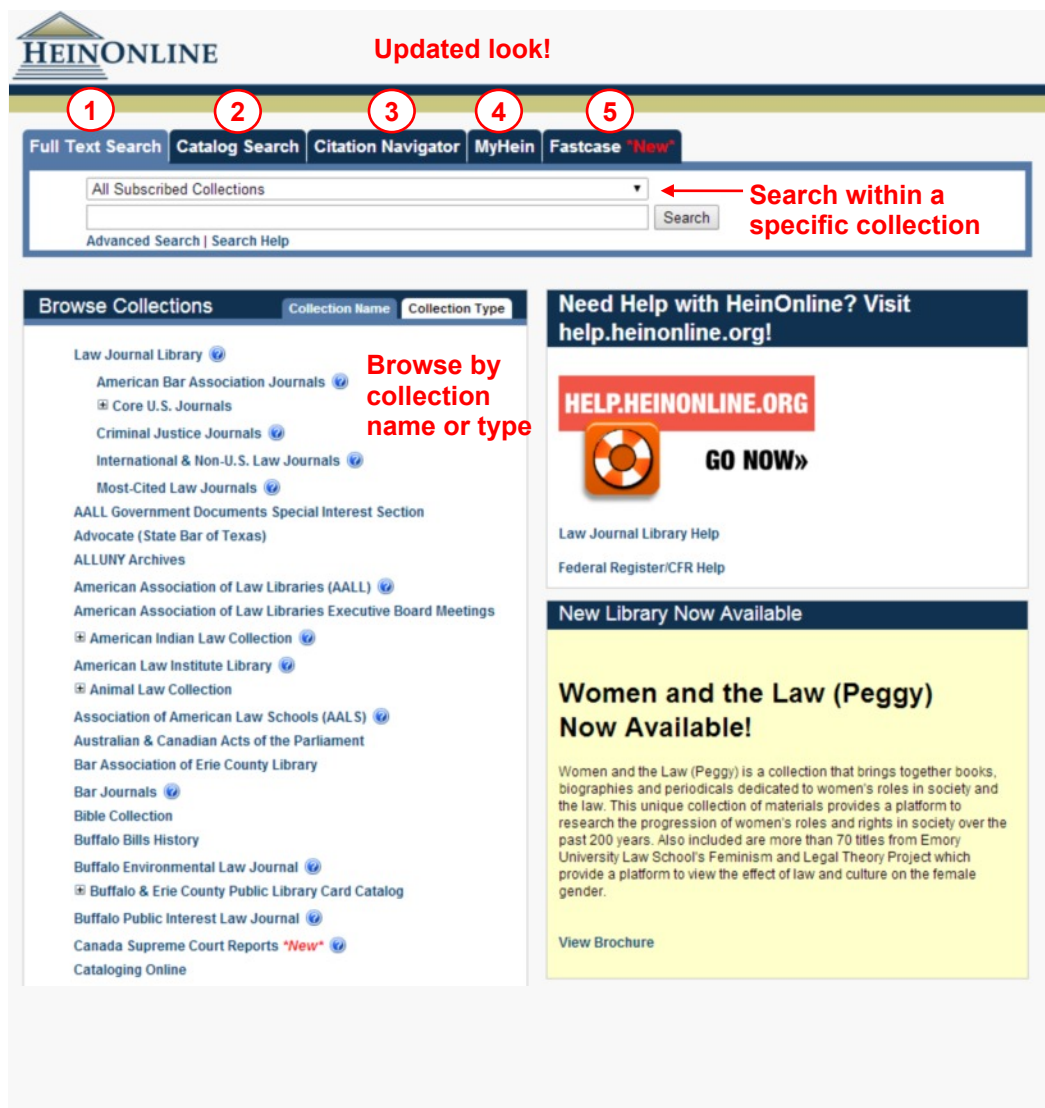

Welcome Page Revamped for User-Friendly Navigating

► New Look When You Log In

You will now see tabs indicating the different options available for searching and navigating when you log into HeinOnline.

1. **Full Text Search** - Previously labeled as Search All Subscribed Collections, this box will allow you to search the full text, title, or author across all your subscribed libraries or a specific collection.
2. **Catalog Search** - Use this box to search for a publication title or author at the volume level across all publications in HeinOnline; some results may not be accessible if you are not subscribed to that collection.
3. **Citation Navigator** - This box will retrieve articles or documents by proper Bluebook citation. This will show results for all publications in HeinOnline; some results may not be accessible if you are not subscribed to that collection.
4. **MyHein** - This box allows you to log into your MyHein account directly from the HeinOnline welcome page.
5. **Fastcase** - This box will appear for HeinOnline core subscribers only, and allows you to insert a case citation to pull up a case.



► Search Within a Specific Collection from the Welcome Page

You can now narrow your search to a specific collection from the 'Full Text' search on the HeinOnline welcome page. Simply use the drop-down menu displayed in the first search box you see once you are logged into HeinOnline to select the collection you would like to search in. To search across all subscribed libraries, leave drop-down menu as "All Subscribed Collections".

► Browse 'Collection Type' View

You now see two options for browsing your subscribed libraries from the Welcome page: 'Collection Name' and 'Collection Type'. 'Collection Type' will show your subscribed collections sorted by collection type including Case Law, Foreign & International Law, International Treaties and Agreements, Periodicals, U.S. - Federal and U.S. State and will show you additional collections available in HeinOnline. 'Collection Name' is the standard alphabetical view.

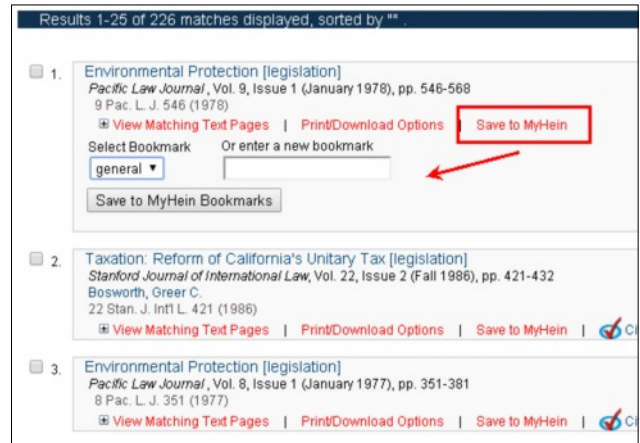
Enhanced MyHein Accounts

Log in Directly from HeinOnline Welcome Page

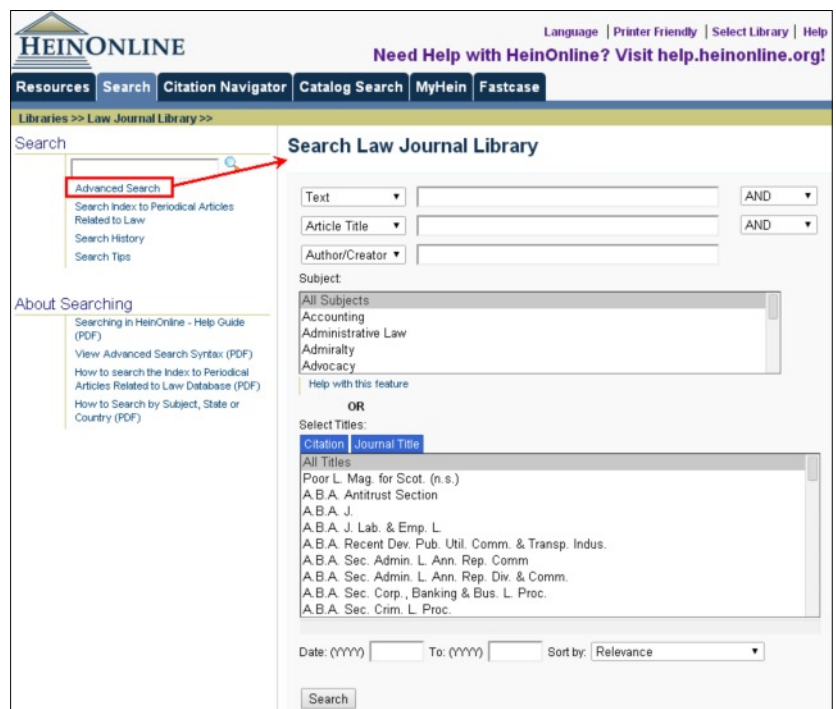
From the HeinOnline welcome page, you now have the option to log into your MyHein account.



Updated Searching Capabilities

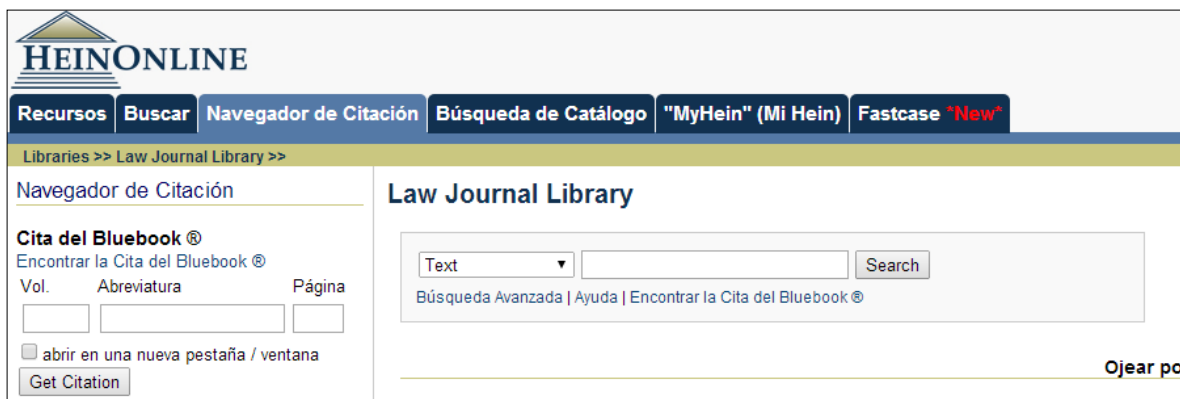
Search Options Renamed

We have renamed our search functions in HeinOnline. What used to be the "Field Search" is now the "Advanced Search" and functions exactly the same as it did when it was the "Field Search". This change was made to better align HeinOnline with how most databases label their search options. The "quick search" box is still available from the search tab and functions the same as it previously did, using the full power of boolean searching.




Spanish Language Interface - ¡Ahora se habla español!

You now have the option to change the language of the HeinOnline interface to Spanish. When you are logged in to HeinOnline, you will see "Language" as an option in the upper right-hand corner; use this link to switch the interface language to Spanish. Once you set the language as Spanish, you will see all navigation tabs and options displayed in Spanish. Please note that documents themselves and publication names will remain in English or their original language.



► ScholarCheck Enhancement - # of Times Accessed

Your HeinOnline search results will now show the number of times articles have been accessed in HeinOnline, in addition to number of times cited. You also have the option to sort your search results by Number of Times Accessed. This information is generated monthly based on overall HeinOnline usage.

MyHein

MyHein is a complimentary tool for users to manage their own personal research. It includes the ability to create and organize bookmarks using tags, add notes to bookmarks, save search queries, email links to bookmarks or search queries, and create title/eTOC and search alerts. With a MyHein account, researchers can export citations of law journal articles to an email, CSV, RefWorks, EndNote, or Zotero.



iPhone/iPad App

Download the free HeinOnline app from the App Store and access HeinOnline everywhere you go! With the app you can view or download the image-based PDFs, access content by citation, browse by volume, navigate a volume with the electronic table of contents, and use full advanced searching techniques. HeinOnline authentication is required to use the app.



ISSN/OpenURL Linking to Your Local Library Catalog

Set up HeinOnline Branding on your account to display your logo on the HeinOnline welcome page and to add custom links to your online catalog, help desk, or other frequently visited links. Establish ISSN linking or OpenURL linking to your local library catalog in instances where HeinOnline does not contain the full text of a title. Ask us for more details about how to set up this complimentary service.
