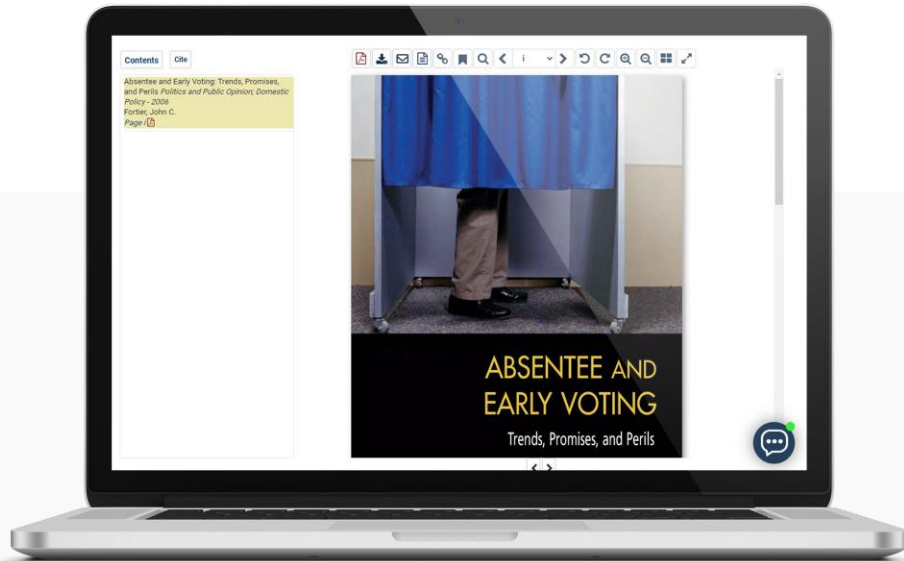

Such competitive pressures might encourage newspapers to focus on **scandal** stories to get attention and hold their market share. ...In column one, the model rejects hypothesis 1 that good quality regimes tend to produce more **scandal**-related articles. ...What this suggests is that better disclosure regimes do not necessarily induce more **scandal** articles, once other state-level controls have been introduced. ...The presence of a governor's race, for example, is likely to increase the number of **scandal** related articles, as is having a state legislature in which control of the lower house hangs in the balance. 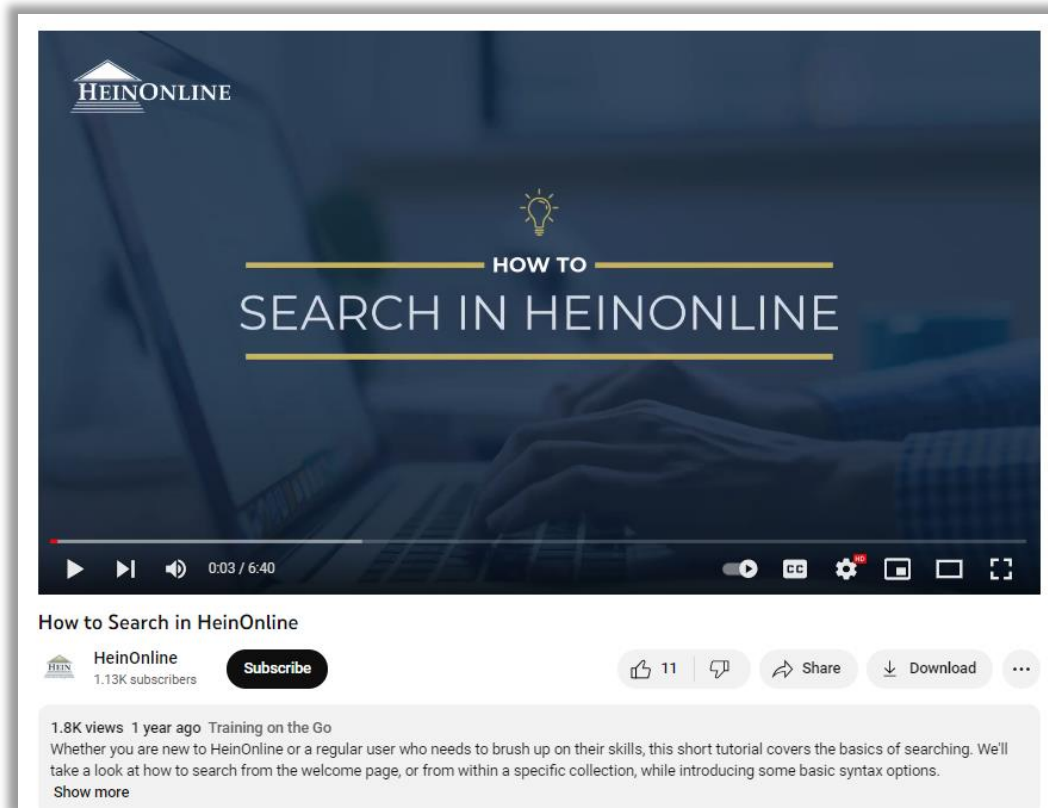
