


UNDERSTANDING ELECTORAL SYSTEMS



- REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY: PEOPLE ELECT OFFICIALS TO CREATE LEGISLATION AND GOVERN ON THEIR BEHALF

Money and Politics: A Perspective on the First Amendment and Campaign Finance Reform

In recent years, under the banner of reform, Congress has enacted legislation that has profoundly affected the way in which federal election campaigns are financed. Some observers believe that the system of campaign finance that has emerged from these reforms remains fundamentally defective, while others attribute many of the faults of the present system to the reforms themselves. Those who would continue to try reform the system by legislation confront not merely an unsympathetic political climate but also a frustrating legal reality: the power of legislatures to purify campaign finance practices is severely limited by the Supreme Court's interpretation of the Constitution.
