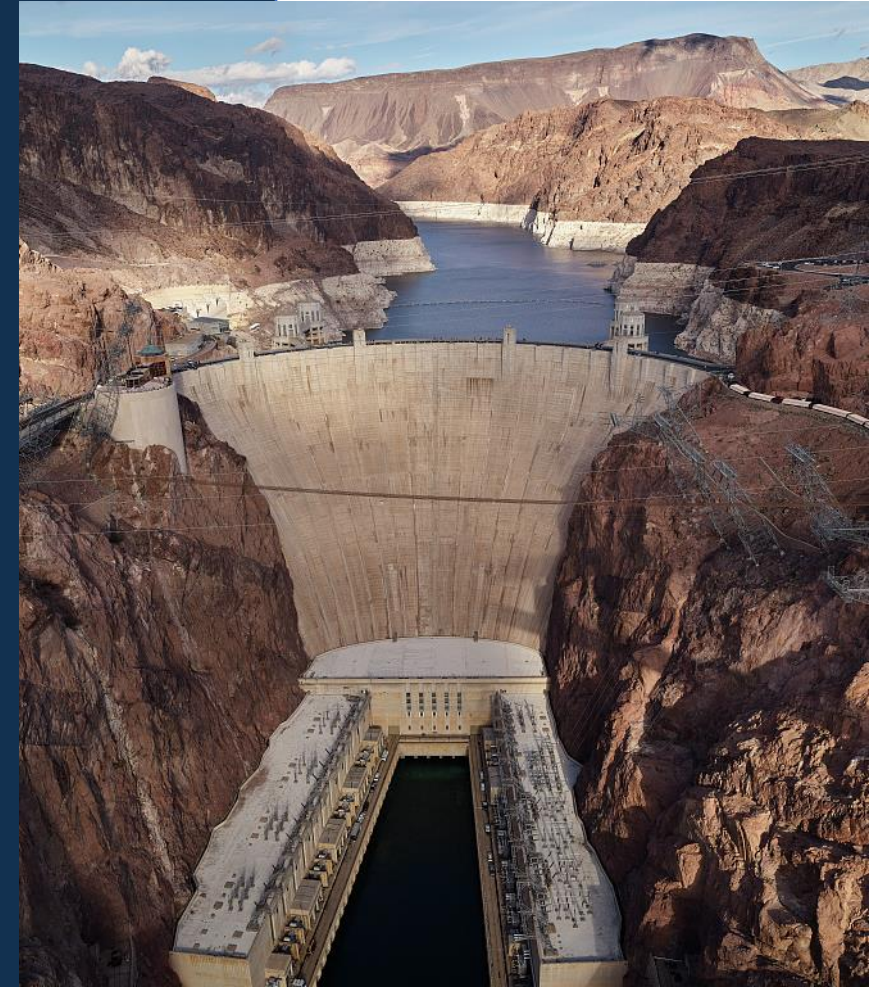

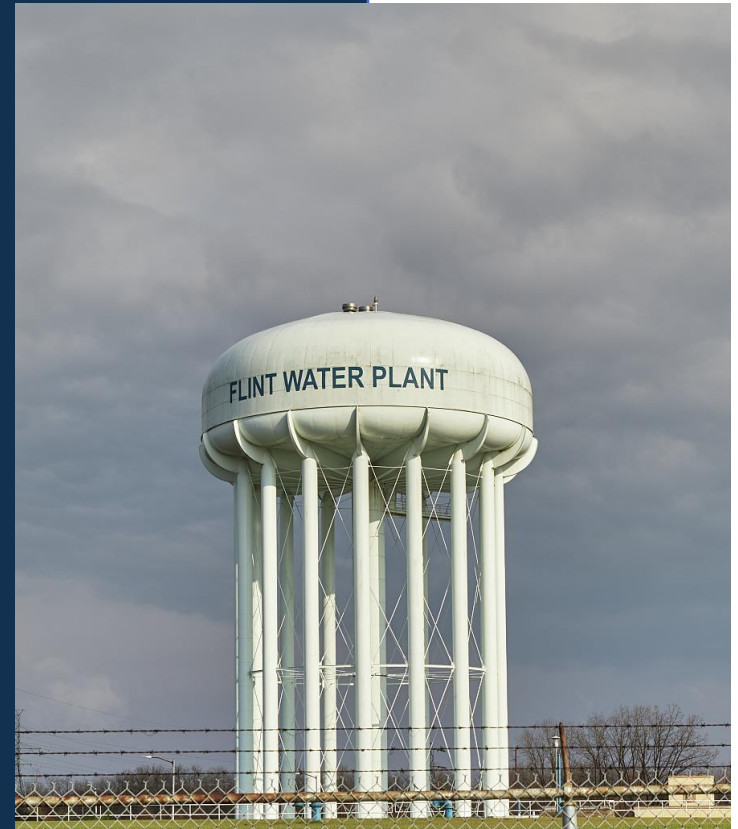

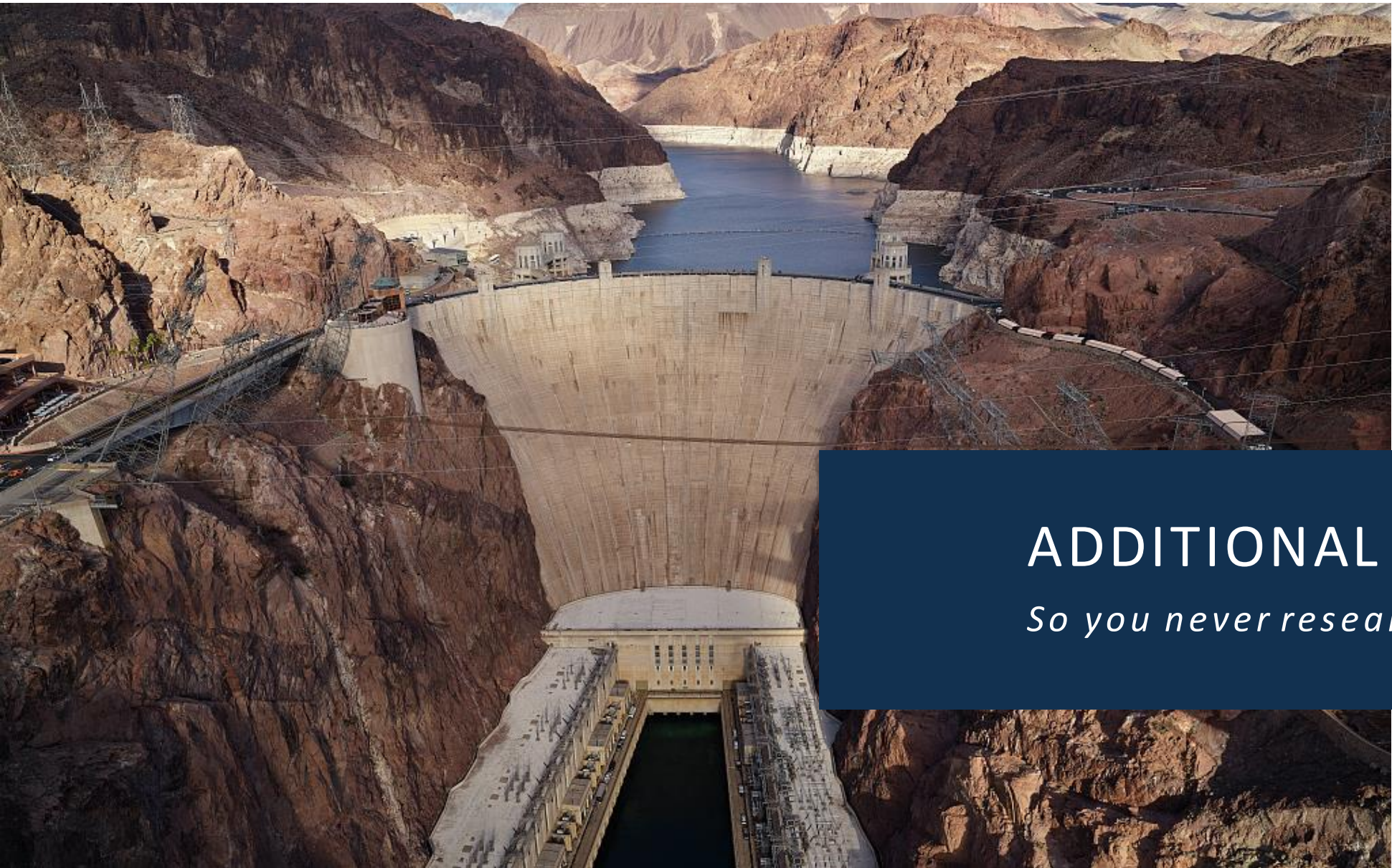

Lake Erie's average depth is only about 62 ft. Consequently, this makes it the warmest of the Great Lakes. Lake Superior has an average depth of almost 500 ft. and goes down 1,332 ft. at its deepest point.

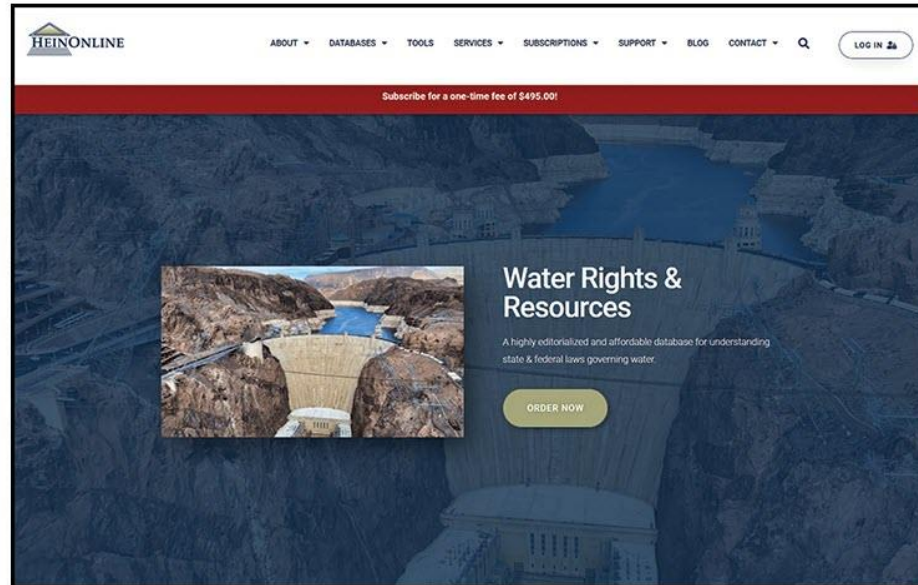
The Oroville Dam in California is 771 ft. tall and was opened in 1968.
