Released August 2021

Fourth addition to the **perpetually free** Social Justice Suite.

Open Society Foundation was established in 2003 to provide expert legal support through human rights litigation.

Justice Initiative represents individuals before domestic and international human rights tribunals.

Includes reports, handbooks, briefing papers, legal and policy submissions, and fact sheets exploring and advocating on issues of human rights and justice.

Released January 2021

A comprehensive collection of works exploring the history of the Law Academy of Philadelphia, one of the first law schools in the United States. Added **free of charge** to all subscribers of the Legal Classics Library.



Law Academy students were assigned different cases representing the plaintiff or defendant, with Academy officers serving as judges in the disputes. View these pamphlets dating back to 1855.



Gold stars denote the titles the editor considers to be most important. These provide a detailed description of the publication and an analysis of its importance to the Law Academy's history.



Various shorter pieces related to the Academy, covering topics such as the bench and bar of Philadelphia, history of the Pennsylvania judiciary, law schools, legal bibliography, and more.

Includes materials relating to the gay rights movement in America from 1950 until the present day.



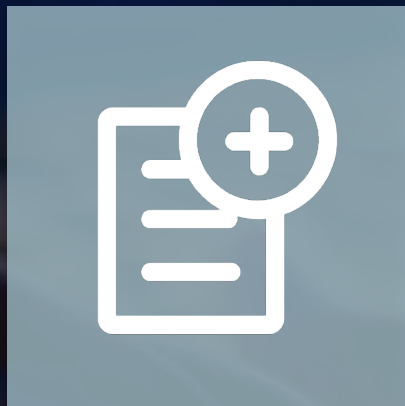

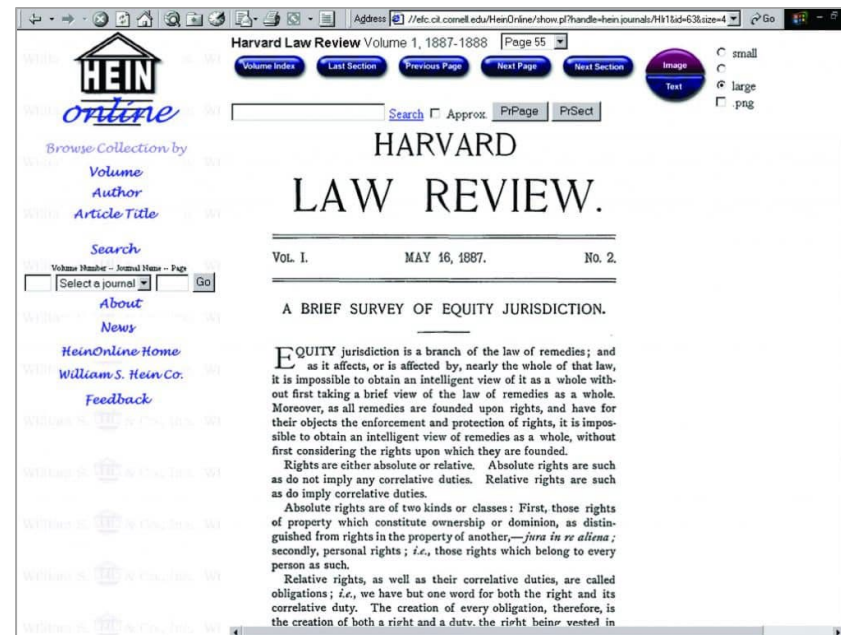
The Law Journal Library Surpassed 3,000 Journals

National Survey of State Laws, 9th Edition

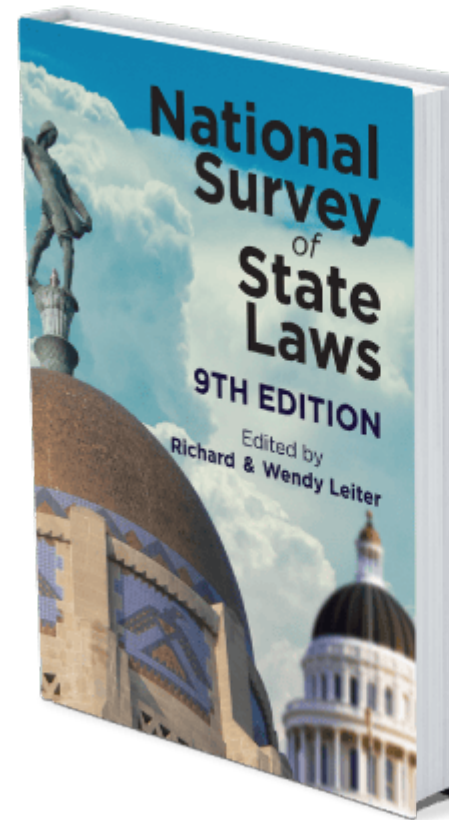

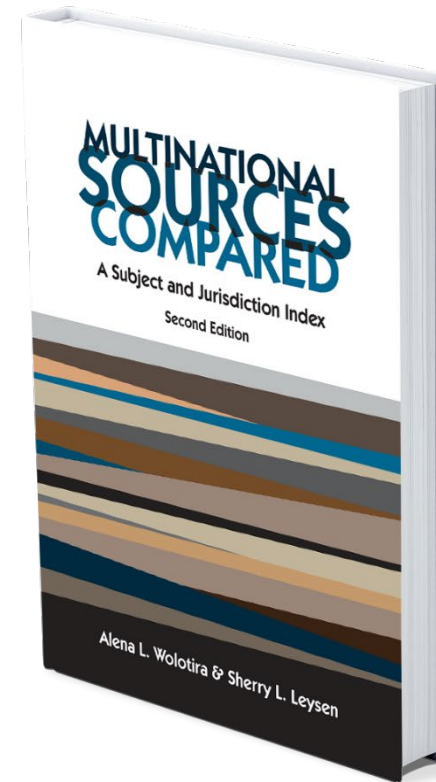
Multinational Sources Compared, 2nd Edition

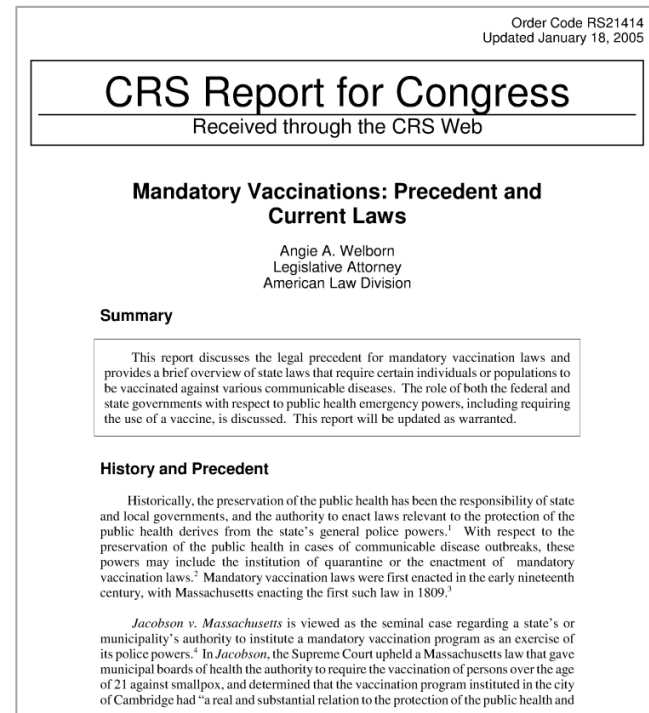
COVID-19: Vaccination Subcollection

A new Vaccination subcollection has been added to our COVID-19: Pandemics Past and Present database. This database includes more than 2,100 titles dedicated solely to the history of inoculations for COVID-19 as well as several other diseases.
